COVID-19-Related Show Cancellation: In the event that the show is cancelled as a result of COVID-19 or COVID-19-related government order, a full refund of all entry fees paid for the show will be issued. If the show is rescheduled for a later date as a result of COVID-19, entrants have the option of keeping their entries in the rescheduled show or receiving a full refund.

COVID-19-Related Entry Cancellation: Anyone who has symptoms consistent with COVID-19 or exposure within the previous 14 days to COVID-19 is asked to cancel any entries into the show; a full credit will be issued for use at a future show, valid through the end of the 2021 show season (healthcare personnel who have treated patients using appropriate medical-grade PPE during the course of performing professional duties are exempted from this restriction).

Official Prize List - register for prize list updates at HorseShowOffice.com

Unpaid Charges: Any exhibitor leaving the show with an unpaid balance on an entry will be billed for the unpaid balance and a \$25/entry billing fee will be added to the total due.

Proof of membership: USEF and USDF registration is verified electronically if valid membership numbers are provided on entry form. **DO NOT SEND** copies of USEF and USDF memberships, horse recordings, or HIDs. If you do not know your numbers at time of entry, send just the numbers as soon as possible after you enter. Memberships should not be renewed directly with USEF or USDF after Monday before the show as verification may not be available in time for the show. Renewals done at the show are effective as of the start of the show.

Great American/USDF Qualifying: Q in class description means *Official Qualifying Class for the 2020 Great American/USDF Regional Championships*. Enter Q in addition to Open, AA, Jr-YR, or Pony and pay additional \$15 USDF fee to have score entered as Great American/USDF qualifying.

USEF Qualifying:

Classes CT and CI are official qualifiers for 2020 Children Dressage National Championship, Classes PT and PI are official qualifiers for 2020 USEF Pony Rider National Championship,

- Classes JT, YT, JI, and YI are official qualifiers for 2020 USEF Junior and Young Rider Dressage National Championships,
- Classes U25I2 and U25GP are official qualifiers for 2020 USEF Young Adult 'Brentina Cup' Dressage National Championships,
- Classes US4, FEI5, FEI6, DHP, and DHG are official qualifiers for 2020 USEF Young and Developing Horse Dressage Championships, and
- Classes FEI5P, FEI5, FEI6P, and FEI6 are official qualifiers for 2020 FEI World Breeding Championships for Young Horses in Dressage (Five and Six Years Olds).

Opportunity Classes: Horses and riders are permitted to cross-enter into other recognized classes. No USEF or USDF memberships or Horse IDs are required for Opportunity Classes and nonmember fees do not apply. Opportunity-class-only entries are also exempt from the \$23 USEF fee. If an entry cross enters into other recognized classes the requirements and fees that normally correspond to those classes apply.

Test-of-Choice Classes: Specify test on entry. Great American/USDF qualification may be elected for any test that can qualify for Great American/USDF Championships. For USEF and FEI TOC, if not specified otherwise in entry, the first TOC test listed will be entered in the first applicable TOC class; the second TOC test, in the second applicable TOC class; the third (if applicable), in the third TOC class.

Para Equestrian Classes: Para equestrian tests are normally run in the size arena specified on the test, but PE tests that specify a 20m x 40m arena may be run in a large arena if USEF rules allow.

Dressage Seat Equitation: Will show at walk, trot, and canter in both directions. The rider's position, seat, and correct use and effect of aids as required by Training and First Level Dressage Tests will be judged.

Awards: Classes will be pinned and ribbons awarded to eight places. In case of a tie, horses will remain tied as described in article DR123.3. Management may split classes into separate classes for Open, AA, and/or Jr-YR.

Combining Classes: Management reserves the right to combine Open, AA, Jr-YR, and/or Pony classes of the same test into a single class with Open, AA, Jr-YR, and/or Pony divisions. In such a case, the individual divisions may still be pinned separately to six places, or the class may be pinned collectively to six places. (If an entrant was in divisions and the classes are combined, the entrant will automatically be placed in the most restrictive division. The entrant has the option of changing divisions up until one

Official Prize List – register for prize list updates at HorseShowOffice.com hour prior to the start of the class. In such a case, the entry fee for the dropped division's original class will be refunded.)

Championships: In determining championships, *Spring Classic I/June I* and *Summer Finale I & II* each count as one show. Champion and Reserve ribbons awarded by points as follows: $1^{st} - 7$, $2^{nd} - 5$, $3^{rd} - 2$, and $4^{th} - 1$. The horse/rider combination with the highest number of points will be Champion; the next highest will be Reserve. Must compete in a minimum of 2 classes per level/division. In case of a tie, the horse/rider combination with the highest average of scores will win. Intro, Opportunity, and Training through Fourth levels of Open, Adult Amateur, and Jr-YR Rider divisions are eligible for championships. High Score Championship and Reserve ribbons awarded in Training, First, Second, Third, and Fourth Level, and Prix St. George, Intermediate I, Intermediate II, and Grand Prix. Minimum score for Champion and Reserve is 60%. Only tests specifically listed above count toward championships. USEF test-of-choice classes do not count toward championship.

Series Grand Championships: Series Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion neck sash ribbons awarded for Intro, Training through Fourth levels of Open, AA, and Jr-YR, Prix St. Georges, Intermediate I, Intermediate II, and Grand Prix. Series Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion are determined by the highest average of the top 4 scores in each level/division at 2019 Waterloo Summer Finale I & II, 2020 Waterloo Spring Classic I & H, Waterloo June I & H, Waterloo July, and Waterloo August. Grand Championship award ceremonies will be held at 2020 Dressage at Waterloo Summer Finale. Opportunity classes do not count toward series grand championships.

National Pony Cup TOC Classes: Classes 1PC, 2PC, and 3PC are designated National Dressage Pony Cup classes. Class is restricted to ponies (measurement card must be submitted with entry, or a measurement must be scheduled with the show secretary). Test options are limited to USDF Intro, USEF Training through Fourth levels, FEI Prix St. Georges, Intermediate I, Intermediate II, and Grand Prix. Cannot ride young horse, developing horse, freestyle, rider, para equestrian, or eventing tests in class 2PC. Also cannot ride any FEI test other than the four tests listed above (PSG, I1, I2, and GP).

National Pony Cup Series Award: To be eligible for NDPC Dressage at Waterloo Pony Series Awards, the same pony/rider combination must participate in at least three out of the four NDPC Partner Shows (Waterloo Spring Classic I/June I, Waterloo July, Waterloo August, and Waterloo Summer Finale I & II) in any pony only class. Test options are limited to USDF Intro, USEF Training through Fourth levels, FEI Prix St. Georges, Intermediate I, Intermediate II, Grand Prix and FEI Pony Tests. Champion and Reserve Champion will be awarded in each division (Open, AA, Jr/YR). USEF Pony Measurement card required. The scores will have a degree of difficulty added in based on the level and test performed; the scores will then be averaged to calculate the winners. See <u>www.dressageponycup.com</u> for degree of difficulty chart. Awards will be mailed concluding the final partner show.

Ransom Memorial Equitation Trophy: The first three places in Jr-YR Rider Equitation at each *Dressage at Waterloo* show through and including *Dressage at Waterloo Summer Finale* qualify to ride in the Equitation Championship at to be held at *Summer Finale*. The winner of the championship class will be this year's winner of the *Ransom Memorial Equitation Trophy*. Founded by Carolyn Van Cise.

Entry Confirmation will be emailed before the show for all entries received by the closing date. Entry must include a valid email address for entry confirmation to be mailed. Add *@HorseShowOffice.com to your approved senders to ensure you receive your confirmation; automated replies from spam blockers are not processed.

Ride Times will be emailed before the show. Include email address for rider, trainer, and/or owner on entry form to have ride times emailed. Ride times also available at www.HorseShowOffice.com. Add *@HorseShowOffice.com to your approved senders to ensure you receive your ride times.

Arenas/Footing: Five 20m x 60m competition arenas; three full sized warm up areas – all-weather sand. Separate lunging areas. PVC board dressage arenas – no chain arenas. Show may elect to run some classes in short arena if test is so approved by USEF.

Stabling: Permanent wooden stalls, 10' x 10' with half doors or temporary vinyl stalls with full door. Horse stalls will be given priority over tack stalls if show becomes full. No initial bedding; can purchase shavings on grounds. If you are bringing a stallion you **MUST** pay for a tack stall to separate other horses. In "stable with" requests, use a name common to all in your group. A minimum of 10 overall early arrival requests must be received to grant early arrival requests. **NO SMOKING IN STABLING AREAS.**

Coggins Test: Every horse must have on file with the show office a negative Coggins test taken no earlier than 12 months prior to the end of the show.

Proof of Vaccination: Every horse must have, either on file with the show office or available upon request by show office, documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering stables. For vaccines administered by veterinarian: documentation should be provided by veterinarian and include name of horse, name of vaccines, date of vaccine administration. For vaccines administered by person other than veterinarian: documentation should include a receipt of vaccine purchase signed by owner; horse name, serial number and expiration date of vaccine and date of vaccine administration. See GR845 Equine Vaccination Rule.

Medical Waste: Sharps containers are located at the end of each barn (and attached to tent poles around the outside of tents in the case of tent stabling). Per USEF rules, competition management may fine any individuals, including trainers, owners, exhibitors, and their agents, up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.

Freestyle Music must be provided in digital .mp3 or .wav format and uploaded to your entry or emailed to info@horseshowoffice.com. If emailed, include show name, horse name, rider name, and freestyle level in email. Please provide music at time of entry if possible; music must be received at least two hours prior to the start of the class. Sound checks are available by appointment starting Thursday or Friday after 6:00 PM or Saturday afternoon during the lunch break.

Pony Measurement: Ponies entered in any pony division or in FEI Pony Tests and in need of USEF measurement cards must make an appointment for measuring with show management prior to the show. The official measurement session will be scheduled on the Thursday before the show. Owners of ponies needing measurement will be charged a fee not to exceed \$100 to cover the cost of providing the measurement.

Camping: Any electrical or water hook-up to a trailer or other vehicle constitutes camping and will incur camping hook-up fees. Camping without hook-up is available at the front camper pad only.

Restrooms: Permanent restroom facilities with showers on grounds.

Other: EMT on grounds. **Veterinarian** on call, phone number posted at show office. **Farrier** on call, phone number posted at show office. **Dogs** must remain leashed and under control at all times.

Parking: Permitted in assigned areas only. Fire lanes must be kept open.

Fun Freestyle Exhibition Class: No entry fee. Rides to be of the highest level horse is competing at the show, to music (vocal permitted), for a maximum of 5 minutes; rider to wear costume. Footwear must have heels and rider's head must be covered per USEF rules. Rides must show one movement required at the level. No penalty for movements exceeding level shown. For entertainment purposes, props and assistants may be used. Scoring procedure available upon request.

Leadline Class: No entry fee. Enter in advance or at the show office by 2:00 PM the day of the class. Participants must submit a completed and signed Dressage Entry Form with a parent/guardian signature. †

United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. Entry Agreement

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaulter or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of the competition. I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable - casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4.

US Equestrian Federation General Rules and Regulations

Show Management reserves the right to vary or add officials, to refuse any entry of any exhibitor for cause, to disqualify any exhibitor and/or his horse for cause, to cause an exhibitor to forfeit his winnings and ribbons for cause, to have horses removed from the grounds for cause, and to return any entry and/or stall fee before or during the show for cause, all without being liable for damage or compensation. Show management reserves the right to make any changes deemed necessary for the safe and efficient conduct of this competition.

EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT FEDERATION RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$45 Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR218) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.



2020 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships

A single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by the United States Dressage Federation (USDF), and recognized by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a Group Member Organization (GMO) is received by April 1 of the prior year. The Regional Championship Program Rules can be found on the USDF website at <u>www.usdf.org</u>. Please refer to the 2020 USDF Member Guide for the comprehensive list of rules and requirements for this program.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying and Championships

All memberships and registrations/recordings must be correct and current at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Rider:

• Must have a USDF Participating* Membership (PM).

• Must have a USEF membership (Junior Active, Senior Active, or Life).

Horse:

- Must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR).
- Must have a USEF (Annual or Lifetime) Horse recording.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s) of record. A horse is not required to have breed registry papers.

Owner:

- Must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership and a USEF membership (Junior Active, Senior Active, Life, or Recorded Farm (with Active Farm Owner)). If the horse has more than one owner, at least one owner must have both active USEF membership and active USDF Participating or Business Membership and must be the owner of record with USEF and USDF. For a business or farm to be the valid owner under this requirement, it must be listed as an owner of the horse with both USEF and USDF.
- * PMs are USDF members who join USDF directly. USDF Group Members (GM) are ineligible.

Minimum Qualifying Scores: One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for Training Level through Grand Prix, in three divisions: open, adult amateur and junior/young rider. FEI Junior and FEI Young Rider classes have only one respective division. Freestyles have only open divisions.

<u>USDF Membership Benefits</u>: USDF is dedicated to education, the recognition of achievement, and promotion of dressage. For details on member benefits, including educational programs, awards, and other opportunities, refer to the USDF Member Guide or the USDF website at www.usdf.org.

This competition is recognized by USDF for 2020

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders

and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those
 sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at
 Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are
 exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot,
 academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM
 identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$90), 5-years (\$360), or life (\$1,800). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$72). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan[®]/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$240) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$35 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$35). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded, but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$80. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$115) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.
